## Driveway Plowing Suggestions

The following are a list of helpful hints for cleaning snow from driveways.

1. Most important is, do not allow children to dig holes or play on snow piles in or near road ways. The plow driver can not see children and something terrible could happen.

2. Home owner is responsible for shoveling out the mail box for the mail delivery person.

3. If you plow any snow across the street you must clean all the snow up that your plow might leave in the street. If not this will get plowed back into your driveway or your neighbors driveway.

4. There is no parking on Town roads during snow event. Vehicles will be towed at the owners expense.

5. The Street department will wing back the snow from the edge of the road after significant snow falls. This is done to provide room for the next snow fall and minimize drifting.

6. If you live on the end of a culdisac you will have snow plowed onto your front yard. This is were the snow is to be stored and is apart of living on a culdisac.

7. When shoveling place the snow to the left side of driveway when facing your house. This helps minimize the amount of snow the street snow plow will release into your driveway as the plow goes by.

8. The snow comes off of the snow plow on the shoulder side of the road, this is a fact. Some snow will go into your drive way and every driveway in Bristol.

9. If you are going to install a mail box install it on the left side of your drive as you are looking at your house. This will also diminish the amount of snow plowed into your driveway.

10. If there is a hydrant near your house please shovel it out so the Fire department can find it in an emergency. This can benefit you and your neighbors in a time of crisis.

11. If your mail box is knocked down by snow coming off of the plow it is the owners responsibility to replace it. If the mail box is knocked down by the plow truck itself the Town will replace it.
