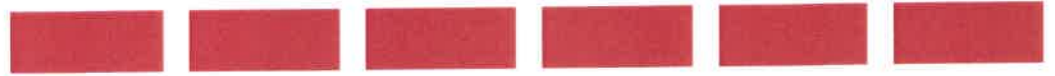

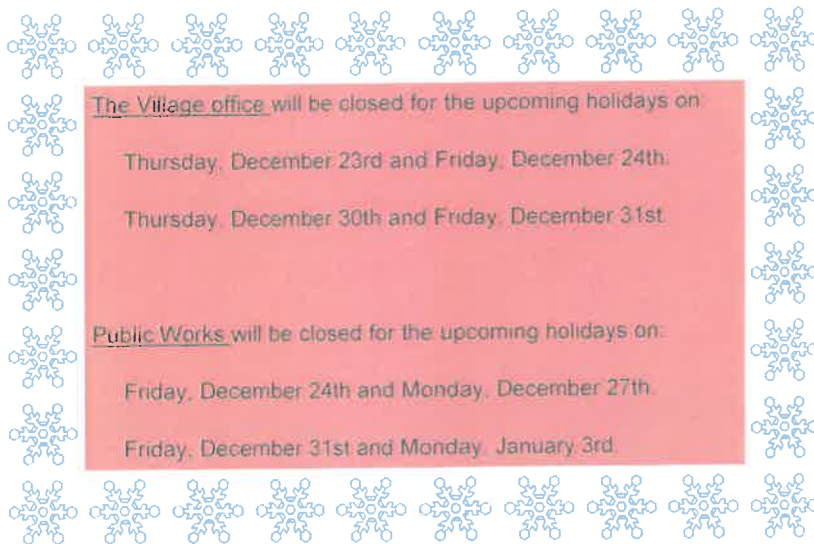

FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Engine Co. 5214 A Pierce Lance pumper-tanker (tender) was delivered new to the Department in 1993 and refurbished by Pierce at their Weyauwega Refurbishment Center between June and early November 2021.

The scope of the refurbishment included numerous upgrades to the 28-year old apparatus that closely parallel the innovations realized with the construction and delivery of the new Truck 5231 in 2018. These upgrades are intended to enhance safety, improve ergonomics and efficiency, extend operational capabilities and prolong the lifecycle of the apparatus with net savings over the procurement of a new, similarly-configured apparatus estimated at nearly \$550,000. Repairs, modifications and upgrades.

The apparatus has been delivered to Station 52 and will now undergo modifications for fitting of equipment before being placed back into service.

A lot of work went into this project and we are very proud of the final product! Thank you again to the Bristol Village Board, the Village Administration, the citizens and businesses of Bristol, Jason at Reliant Fire Apparatus, Al and the crew at the Pierce Refurbishment Center and the committee that worked on this project for their incredible support in bringing a far more capable and reliable apparatus to our protective arsenal!



NEW SEWER RATES FOR 2022

Utility District 1 is located in the center area of the Village near and around the Village Hall and continuing south to Lake George.

The wastewater treatment facility was built in 1987 and has needed replacement of some major equipment. In 2020, the Village replaced the Raw Screw pumps at a cost of \$290,000.

We also conducted sewer inflow and infiltration studies for the area near 198th avenue and 82nd street that sewer has surcharged in the past. Flow test and smoke tests were also done as well as cleaning and televising the area. We relined various sewer mains in the area at a cost of \$53,000.

Residents in this area were notified by letter about the issues with their sewer laterals. Residents have been working on these issues over the past year and will continue to do so in the future.

The force mains at the north and east Lake George lift stations have failed quite a few times. The Wisconsin DNR has required the Village to replace these two force mains. The work has been bid and will begin in December at a cost of 1.3 million dollars.

All this work requires the rates to increase about \$27 dollars per month for residents. A quarterly bill will go from \$153 per quarter to \$235.35 per quarter. There is also an increase in the surcharges for non-residential customers.

PUBLIC WORKS would like to remind all residents—

Not to park on village streets. This not only prevents them from plowing snow during the winter months where cars are parked, but also makes it difficult for emergency vehicles from getting through in the event of a fire, or emergency call. It is also against our village parking ordinance and if not observed can carry a fine for parking on a village road.

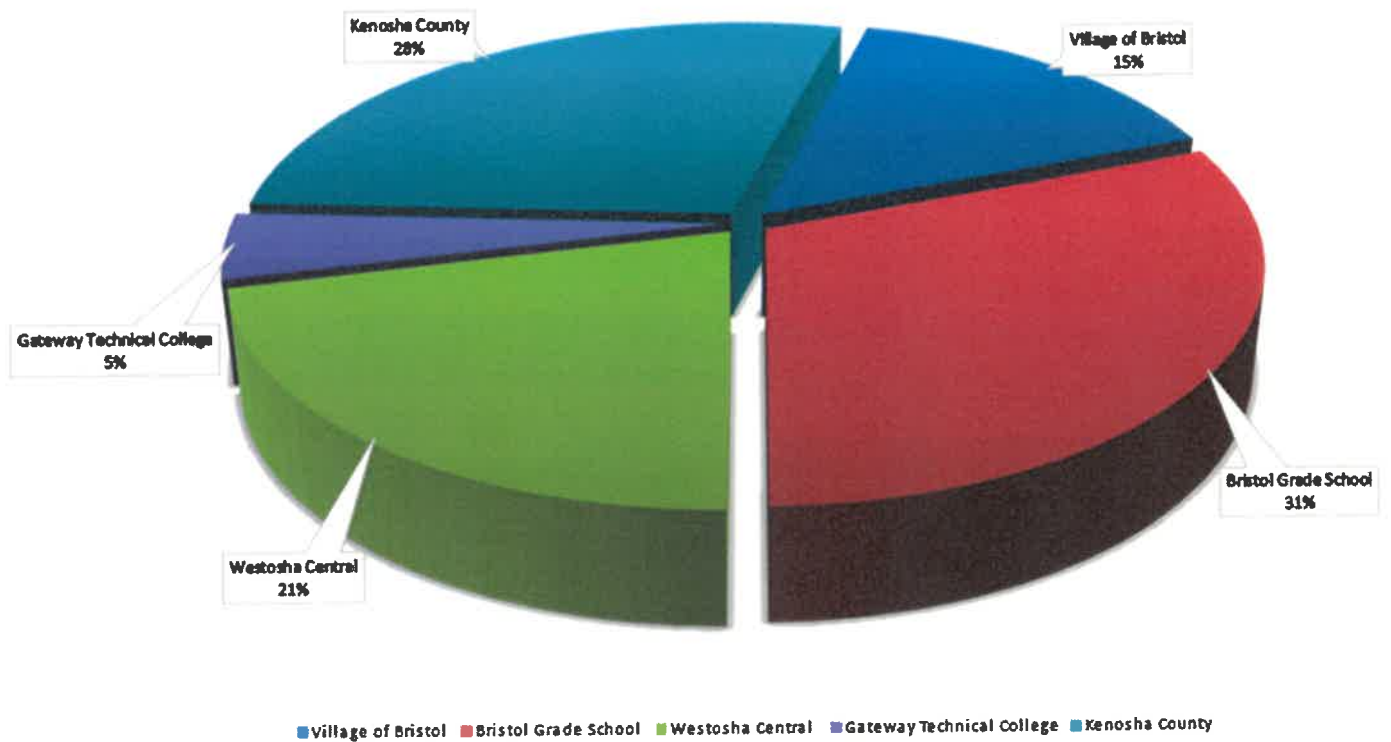

KENOSHA COUNTY TREE PROGRAM IS OPEN TO EVERYONE - YOU DO NOT NEED TO BE A KENOSHA COUNTY RESIDENT TO PARTICIPATE.

COMMON NAME	DESCRIPTION AND CHARACTERISTICS
AMERICAN ELDERBERRY	A shrub with large flattened clusters of tiny cream-colored flowers in summer. Fragrant; large clusters of small dark purple berries in late summer. Full sun to partial shade; moist, well-drained soils are best, but will tolerate some dryness as well as wet sites; tolerates alkaline soil. Can grow up to 12' tall and 10' wide.
BLACK CHERRY	Tree which bears dark green leaves which turn yellow to red in fall and white flowers which bloom in spring. Also edible fruit in summer. Is a good wildlife species. Grows to a height of 50-60 feet.
BLACK CHOKEBERRY	Black chokeberry is a deciduous, cold-hardy shrub, showing white flowers in the spring and colorful red foliage and heavy, dark fruit in the fall. Tolerates partial shade but thrives in full sun. It is also an excellent choice for those tough, low-lying wet areas, yet it can acclimate itself to dry locations as well. It reaches 4-8 feet in height. Black chokeberry provides browse for white-tailed deer and rabbits, and fruits for ruffed grouse.
BLACK WALNUT	One of the scarcest and most coveted native hardwoods, Used especially for furniture, gunstocks, and veneer. Fragrant leaves. Likes deep, rich, well-drained soil; grows more slowly in drier soils. Grows to 50' to 75', 60' spread. The delicious nuts must be gathered early, before squirrels and other wildlife can consume them.
BALSAM FIR	This pyramidal evergreen will grow in cool, moist and swampy areas. Dark flat needles 1/2-1" long, slow growing, symmetrical, evergreen tree. Soft, bright green needles. Nice fragrance for Christmas trees. Mature height 75' mature spread 20'.
COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE	One of the most popular ornamental conifers, the Colorado blue spruce (or simply, blue spruce) grows best in full sun, in moist, well-drained, fertile soils. The Colorado blue spruce grows to a height of 50-75' and a spread of 10-20' at maturity. Needles are stiff, short, and silvery blue to greenish blue in color. The species has an excellent natural shape and requires little shearing.
COMMON LILAC	The Common Lilac is noted for its showy, fragrant bloom in late spring. Flowers come in many colors ranging from white, pink, blue, lavender to reddish-purple, clusters of flowers sit against dark green, heart shaped leaves, and the fragrance is just delightful. Grows best in well drained, fertile soils, under full sunlight. Average height is 15'.
EASTERN ARBORVITAE	Up to 20 feet tall and 6-8 feet wide at maturity. Very dark green color year-round. Medium growth rate and very hardy. Used for screening and foundation planting. When young it grows bushy but when it gets to 3-4 feet it grows more pyramidal. They prefer full sun to partial shade and can grow in a variety of soil conditions.
FRASER FIR	A favorite of many for a Christmas tree. This tree has an excellent fragrance with exceptional needle retention. Strong branches are turned slightly upward which give the tree a compact appearance and shows the silvery color. Full to partial sun. Likes cool, moist, well-drained soils. Height 30-40 ft Width 20-25 ft.
HAZELNUT	A large fast-growing shrub with showy spring flowers. The Hazelnut can grow to 8-12' tall with a crown spread of 10', creating a dense privacy screen, perfect for a hedgerow and as nesting sites for birds. The nuts of this American Hazelnut have a higher nutritional value than acorns and beechnuts, making them a valuable food source for wildlife eaten by turkey, ruffed grouse, and pheasants.
NORTHERN RED OAK	One of the faster growing oak trees. Has reddish fall color and grows to a height of 60-75 feet with similar width and a broad rounded shape. Excellent for wildlife planting.
NORWAY SPRUCE	The Norway Spruce is the most widespread, fastest growing, largest and most disease resistant spruce in the northern hemisphere. This is not a tree for a small yard! The Norway Spruce can grow 2-3+ feet per year their first 25 years under good conditions. The Norway spruce has a fibrous deep spreading root system, able to withstand strong winds.
PIN OAK	Relatively fast-growing oak tree with bright red fall color. Will grow to a height of 60-70 feet with a width of 25-40 feet. Often used as a street tree in urban settings.
RED-OSIER DOGWOOD	Grows best in moist to wet soils with full sunlight. Average height is 8' and it spreads outward to 6'. Has bright red twigs with white flowers and white berries in the summer. Leaves turn dark red in the fall. The shrub's deep red stems create a pop of color in the snowy, gray months. Fibrous root systems also provide effective erosion control on banks and slopes. Good for providing wildlife food and cover.
RIVER BIRCH	The River Birch is generally tolerant of many soil conditions. In optimal conditions will grow to a height of 40-70 feet with a width of 40-60 feet. Has a reddish-brown exfoliating bark and is generally resistant to bronze birch borer.
WHITE PINE	The White Pine is a large, straight-stemmed tree with a pyramidal crown. Clustered soft blue-green needles. Ideal screen or windbreak. Likes moist, well-drained soils. Grows 50' to 80' with a 20-40' spread.
WATER GEL ONE BAG WILL TREAT ABOUT 100 TREES	Water Gel is a powder, which is mixed with water to form a gel that the roots of the seedling are dipped into. The gel acts as a water-holding medium and helps to maintain an even moisture balance around the seedling roots after planting. The gel will remain active for at least one growing season.

2021 Tax Assessment Distribution by % of Each Dollar (Bristol Grade/Westosha Central District)

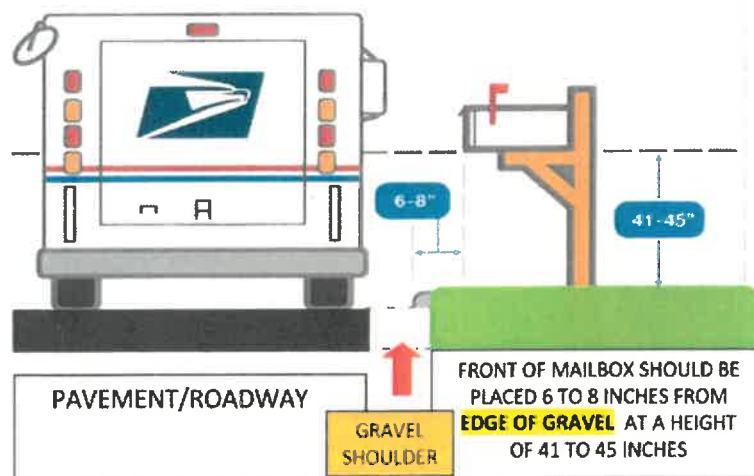

GUIDELINES FOR MAILBOX POSITIONING BY ROADWAY

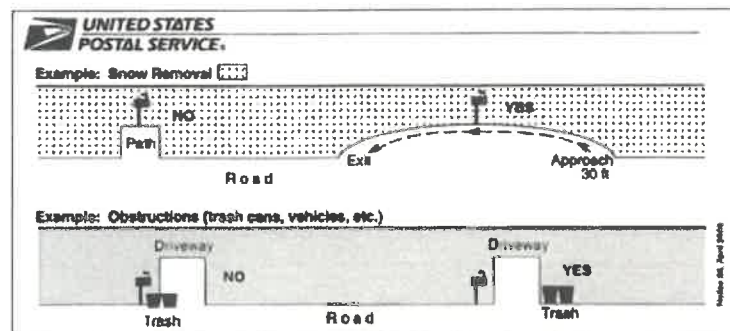


The paving project is now complete.

Also, please make sure your home address is clearly visible for mail delivery and emergency response.

The following diagram has been provided by the USPS for proper snow removal and trash can placement.



USEFUL INFORMATION

Please visit our website villageofbristol.org to make the following types of payments (except Burn Permits):

*Payments can be made at the village office during office hours, or can be placed in the drop box located by the front entrance doors. If you would like a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope.

2021 PROPERTY TAXES: Payments can be made at the village office during regular business hours, or be mailed to: 19801 83rd St. Bristol, WI 53104, or placed in the drop box located by the front entrance, or paid online (fee required.) If your mortgage company sends the check to you and it is made out to you AND the village, you will need to endorse the check. YOUR TAX PAYMENT CHECK ****MUST**** BE SEPARATE FROM ANY OTHER PAYMENT BEING MADE TO THE VILLAGE.

2022 DOG LICENSES: You must provide a copy of your dogs current certificate of rabies vaccination. All dogs 5 months and older are required to have a dog license which is valid January 1-December 31. A \$5 late fee will be added to the cost of the license after March 31st. Neutered/Spayed \$5, not neutered/spayed \$11.

BURN PERMITS *(payments not available online)*

Outdoor fires require a burn permit which is valid January-December. Please call the Fire Department Burn Line at **857-4063** for the current burn status just prior to burning. Permits can be purchased at the Village Hall during regular business hours or at the Fire Department nights and weekends. First time permits are \$25, and renewals are \$15.

BUILDING PERMITS

If you are doing any type of home renovations please visit our website and complete a building permit application. A zoning permit is also required in addition to the building permit if you are building a garage, shed, fence, accessory building, or adding on to a building.

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS at the Village Office

The Village of Bristol is now accepting credit card payments in the village office for anything payable to the village. There is a convenience fee of 3%.

ONLINE PAYMENTS NOW AVAILABLE!

Payments can now be made online for: sewer/water bills, taxes, invoices payable to the village, traffic citations, and building permits. There is a 2.75% convenience fee if paying with a debit or credit card, or a \$1 fee if paying by e-check. Visit our website to make your payments.

Accepts: brush, grass, leaves, cooking oil, waste oil, anti-freeze, scrap steel.
